Artist Statement

Born and raised in Beijing, Lexy (also known as Xiao Liangzi) is an artist and researcher, currently based in Bergen. She works with alternative photographic processes, textile, and moving images, regarding photography as performance and action above the content of the image. She sees her artistic practice as a way to reach self-awareness and self-transcendence. She is interested in repetitive gestures, durational performance, materiality, exploring how time, perception, and repetition can produce a form of visibility and aesthetic experience. Her practice is about experimentally performing the making processes- a repeated working process, investigating the ways to interpret pairs of paradoxical ideas around repetition, such as degradation and superposition, interruption and continuity, permanence and impermanence. She tends to interpret her investigations in a philosophical way, trying to build a connected, consistent and poetic theory system through her artistic practice

Redefinition of the Photographic Chemicals

In the project *Redefinition of the Photographic Chemicals*, Lexy chose analogue photographic chemicals as her subjects, to re-visualize, reshape and reinterpret them, in order to provide a new way of seeing and understanding the chemicals, which leads to the semiotics of photography, in this digital dominated age. Typically, the focus is on the content of the image or its creation process, neglecting the vital chemicals, e.g. developer and fixer. These chemicals bring analogue photographs to life but are often overlooked. She aims to make these liquids and powders, stored in bottles, tanks, and bags, more visually appealing to others, and let the materials of analogue photography explain its own subject, and vice versa. The project also includes a single edition light sensitive handmade book, *Chemical Photographs*, as the statement of the project that the viewers can hold, touch and read.

Impermanent Shadows

Impermanent Shadows works with the concept of durational images- the images as the performers that are unfixed, dynamic and constantly growing. They are made by applying different photosensitive materials and cameraless photography, with light reinvention as both the creator and the destroyer. The process of creating the traces carves being of the plants into another substance, as if the substance is carrying the life of the flora to extend their lifespan, while the substance itself is becoming alive. The traces become the durational images, they change, grow, or even fade away; the fictional flora grows and withers, having their own journeys in the world. The project consists of two parts, the lumen murals with the performance about Lexy unveiling the plants layer attached to the wall and then placing the plants in a vase; the other part is the artist's books, *Lumen* and *Cyanolumen*, which the viewers can hold and read on their hands.
